LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

St. Paul's is situated on the traditional territories of the Erie, Neutral, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee, and Mississaugas. This land is covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, which was an agreement between the Haudenosaunee and Anishinabek to share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. All peoples have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect. We further acknowledge that this land is covered by the Between the Lakes Purchase, 1792, between the Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. Land acknowledgments are essential as we move forward on a path to reconciliation and are guided by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's 94 Calls to Action.

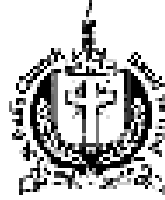

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Land Development at St. Paul's - Representatives of the Session of St. Paul's are continuing their negotiations with a real estate developer with respect to selling the land on which St. Andrew's Hall sits to build housing. We rejected an earlier offer as it did not sufficiently benefit St. Paul's. The developer has made a new offer, and we are working with our lawyer to respond. The new offer includes an upfront cash payment and the shared use of a meeting hall, kitchen, classrooms, and parking spaces. The new offer is conditional on the developer obtaining the required building permissions, financing, and pre-sales of condominium units, which will likely take three years. If the Session feels that the new offer can be countered to benefit the future of St. Paul's greatly, we will bring the offer to the congregation. If the congregation approves the offer, we will seek permission from the Presbytery to proceed. We have some optimism about this development; however, there are many hurdles that have yet to be cleared. We ask that all members of St. Paul's pray about this matter and ask God to guide us on how to proceed best as we evaluate this opportunity.

Thank you to the Presbytery, and Thank you to Cultural Heritage Planning, Hamilton - St. Paul's is grateful to the Presbytery of Hamilton for a gift of \$19,000 to cover the cost of the fencing around vulnerable areas of our building. The GST portion of the gift will be returned to the Presbytery once we receive our GST rebate for the purchase. The Presbytery recognizes the exceptional work that St. Paul's is doing with unhomed persons and persons struggling with opioid addiction in the downtown. They also recognize that our outreach ministries sometimes put our building in jeopardy, so they were glad to provide the gift that will allow us to continue our important ministries. We appreciate that the Presbytery shares our vision

and is willing to support it. We are also thankful to Cultural Heritage Planning, Hamilton, for responding in person and quickly to our request to put up the fencing. They came here in person, expressed thanks to St. Paul's for the way we have maintained this building, and quickly approved the fencing. They understand The risks associated with being in downtown Hamilton and were eager to make exceptions to their own guidelines to allow us to protect our building.
