<sup>1</sup> 'I am the real vine, and my Father is the gardener. <sup>2</sup> Every barren branch of mine he cuts away; and every fruiting branch he cleans, to make it more fruitful still. <sup>3</sup> You have already been cleansed by the word that I spoke to you. <sup>4</sup> Dwell in me, as I in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself, but only if it remains united with the vine; no more can you bear fruit, unless you remain united with me. <sup>5</sup> 'I am the vine, and you the branches. He who dwells in me, as I dwell in him, bears much fruit; for apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup> He who does not dwell in me is thrown away like a withered branch. The withered branches are heaped together, thrown on the fire, and burnt. <sup>7</sup> 'If you dwell in me, and my words dwell in you, ask what you will, and you shall have it. <sup>8</sup> This is my Father's glory, that you may bear fruit in plenty and so be my disciples.
