Brenda Gains Confidence in Nicaragua

Brenda Francisca Méndez Ñurinda is an entrepreneur and mother of two, living in Nicaragua.

"I come from a large family with few economic resources, but very hardworking," she explains.

During her first years of motherhood, Brenda experienced domestic violence. After leaving the abusive relationship, Brenda looked for work at the local market, where she earned minimal pay for her efforts.

To improve her family's future prospects, Brenda participated in a program implemented by PWS&D's local partner, INPRHU. Through the training she received, Brenda developed the knowledge and confidence to start her own small shop.

"Each workshop strengthened me. I found a space to share, learn and improve my self-esteem as a woman and mother. My children are my greatest motivation. I decided to resume my high school studies on Sundays, and I am proud of my achievements. Now, I am an entrepreneur," she shares with excitement.

Ways St. Paul's Congregation may participate in Mission during Advent 2025

- 1. Donate <u>items of warm winter clothing</u> for people who come to our door in need. Items may be placed in a tote located in St Andrew's Hall.
- 2. You will have an opportunity to purchase a mission gift for **Presbyterian World Service and Development** and place a decoration on our Christmas tree in celebration of your gift.
- 3. Sandu's Apartment Several more administrative barriers have been cleared and we hope that the family from Eritrea we are helping to sponsor will arrive in Canada shortly. A list of required items is posted on the bulletin board. Donations can be placed in a tote in St. Andrew's Hall, marked <u>Sandu's</u> <u>Apartment</u>.
- 4. We have set a goal of \$50,000.00 for our <u>Year-End</u>
 <u>Fundraiser</u>. A portion of the Year-End Fundraiser will go towards offsetting our deficit, and a portion will go to Hamilton Out of the Cold.

Hamilton Out of the Cold is a not-for-profit, non-denominational program that provides meals for those in need in our community from November to March. Their mission is to provide hot nutritious meals served with dignity and compassion. To learn more about their program:

Thanks to St. Paul's for their part in this Christmas miracle. Sandu and her family will arrive in Canada on Jan. 10, 2026

On Saturday, January 10, 2026, Sandu and her three children will arrive in Canada from a refugee camp in Israel. Their place of origin is the East African country of Eritrea, bordered by Sudan, Ethiopia and the Red Sea.

In June of 2024, St. Paul's received a request to help sponsor this family of four fleeing the dictatorship in Eritrea. The people of St. Paul's immediately accepted the challenge, with great love and enthusiasm.

In October of 2024, the application was completed, and the Eritrean community in Hamilton provided \$41,000 in financial assistance, which exceeded the \$30,000 required to support a sponsorship. The funds were invested in GICs.

The Refugee Committee applied for a two-bedroom townhouse through Kiwanis non-profit housing.

In November of 2024, we received confirmation from the Canadian Refugee Committee that the application had been received and approved. For a period of several months, there was no communication, and we worried about the status of Sandu and her family in the context of violence in the Middle East.

In October of 2025, we received word that all of Sandu's documents had been approved, including her VISA for travel to Canada.

In October of 2025, a two-bedroom apartment just a five-minute walk to Hess Street school was secured through Kiwanis. The people of St. Paul's have been generous in providing furniture and other provisions for Sandu's new home.

On December 7, 2025, a flight to Canada was arranged for Sandu and her three children. They will arrive in Canada on Saturday, January 10, 2026.
